Find the radius and interval of convergence of the power series $\sum_{n=1}^{\infty}(-1)^{n} \frac{(x-1)^{n}}{n^{2}}$. (Check end-points as well!)

## Problem 1

This problem has two separate questions. (Answer all the questions!)
(a) Find the area of the triangle with vertices $P(1,1,1), Q(2,2,1)$ and $R(0,-1,0)$.
(b) The region bounded by the line $y=x$ and the curve $y=x^{2}$ is rotated about the horizontal line $y=-1$. Find the volume of the solid obtained in this way.

## Problem 2

(a) Use the power series of $\frac{1}{1+x^{4}}$ to write the function $f(x)=\frac{x}{1+x^{4}}$ as a power series.
(b) Use the series in part (a) to find the minimum number of terms needed to approximate the integral

$$
\int_{0}^{1 / 10} \frac{x}{1+x^{4}} d x
$$

with an error less than $10^{-10}$. (You do not need to compute and add up the terms in the sum!)

## Problem 3

Find the work done in pumping all the water out of a cubic container with edge 6 m which is $1 / 3$ full (i.e., the container is one third full). The water has to be lifted all the way to the top of the cube in order to be removed. (You may use the approximation $g \approx 10 \mathrm{~m} / \mathrm{s}^{2}$ and the water density $\rho=1,000 \mathrm{~kg} / \mathrm{m}^{3}$.)

## Problem 4

Two planes are given by the equations $2 x+y-z=2$ for the plane $\mathcal{P}_{1}$ and $x-y-z=1$ for the plane $\mathcal{P}_{2}$.
(a) Determine whether or not these planes are parallel (justify your answer). If they are, find the distance between them. Otherwise, answer part (b) below.
(b) Find both the parametric equations and the symmetric equations of the line of intersection of the planes $\mathcal{P}_{1}$ and $\mathcal{P}_{2}$ (if you have $\overline{\text { determined }}$ in part (a) that they are not parallel).
