7 5 W'S OF THE MAJORS DISCOVERY FAIR

What happens when "What do you want to be when you grow up?" becomes "What is your major?" Both can be challenging questions to answer – especially since the answer does not have to be the same for both questions, and it usually isn't. Undergraduate students can gather information to help with these questions (and many others) at the Majors Discovery Fair.

WHAT is the Majors Discovery Fair?

ACADEMIC & CAREER CONSIDERATIONS

- Are there any specializations or areas of emphasis within your degrees?
- Are there any scholarships available specifically for students in this major?
- Is there an introductory course students can take to determine if this major is a good match?
- What are some of the most excited aspects of this major? Most challenging?

GETTING IN

- Are there any specific requirements a student must meet before they can declare this major?
- What is the math requirement for this major? Science?
- Does this major participate in Undergraduate Research, Study Abroad, or Service Learning?
- Can I add a minor easily?

GETTING A JOB

- What skills will this major help me develop?
- What kinds of internships are available?
- What kind of jobs do students who graduate with this major typically pursue?
- What is the job market like for students who graduate with this degree?
- What percentage of graduates typically obtain jobs related to this major?

GRADUATE SCHOOL

- Is graduate school usually required to work in the fields associated with this major?
- What kind of graduate program can I go into with this degree?
- What are the requirements for acceptance into those programs?
